now Hope Church, where she
taught a Sunday School class
for many years. In her spare

time, she enjoyed reading, crafts, gardening and traveling.

Alveda is survived by her sister, Geneva Ahlberg, some cousins, and many nieces and nephews.

Along with her parents, she was preceded in death by her sisters, Leora Johnson and Arlene (Wallace) Lindskoog and her brothers, Reuben (Elaine) and Eldon (Florence) Johnson.

“ *My first teaching job was being an ESEA Title 1 math K-6 teacher at Osborn School. I remember meeting Miss Alveda Johnson. She was one of the K-1 reading teachers who had a special room in the second classroom wing. She was a great traditional instructor.*
