It is with deep sorrow and so much love that we mourn the passing of Bobbie Gale Burke. A resident of Oakdale, CA, Bob passed away on August 22, 2020, at the age of 77.

Bob was born in Hayward, CA on November 30, 1942 to John Harrison Burke and Winnie Juanita Cranford. He grew up in Hayward with his parents and sister, Glenna Sue (Susie) Simpkins. Bob retired from Owens-Illinois in 1996 as a machinist after devoting 35 years to the company. He was extremely skilled in his trade and took every opportunity to expose these skills to his daughters and grandchildren.

In addition to being a talented machinist who was able to fix anything, Bob G. Burke was an avid horseman. He had a unique ability to breed, foal, and train quality horses. This passion surrounded every aspect of his life. Before his father passed, you could always find them working together in the horse arena. His daughters also share a love and respect for horses which has, and will continue to be, passed on for many generations to

come. Bob left behind his pride and joy stallion, "Woody", who will live the rest of his life retired out in the pasture.

Bob also enjoyed planning and building. He spent many years building his legacy in Tracy, CA with his father, John Burke, by his side. Without the help and support of his wife and four daughters, their beautiful ranch would have never been possible. Through these experiences, Bob taught his daughters the importance of hard work and to never give up. Each of them learned how to swing a hammer using their left hand (even though they were all right handed!).
