Hanson, Sr. of Turlock, CA, husband Scot Morgan of Turlock, CA, children Andy Morgan (Alicia) of Turlock, CA, and Adam Morgan (Michelle Miller) of San Francisco, CA, brother James C. Hanson, Jr. "Beaver" (Katherine) of Turlock, CA, grandmother Lory Moore of Lodi, CA. She will be missed by many other relatives, friends, and coworkers whom she loved.
