Donald "Don" Curry, 50, was born to Willard and Dorothy Curry at the old Collins Hospital in Turlock. He died Thursday at his home in Denair.

He attended local schools and graduated from Turlock High in 1978. He also attended MJC and CSUS. He spent much of his working life in construction, the last 15 years as Director of Construction of JKB Homes.
