Doyle D. Brown, 91, passed away peacefully on Friday, August 30, 2019 in Folsom, CA.

Doyle was born in Texas on July 12, 1928 to Sherman and Willie Brown. Raised in Mount Ida, AR, he attended the Arkansas School for the Deaf in Little Rock, AR and graduated in 1949.

He met the love of his life, Charlotte Corrine and they married in March of 1966 in Las Vegas, NV.

He resided in both Fremont, CA and Lake Havasu, AZ for some time before finally settling down in Orangevale, CA.

Doyle worked for the newspaper industry - printing and mailing – for over 40 years before finally retiring in 1996. In his spare time, he enjoyed traveling and participating in his Deaf bowling league. He also loved being involved in Deaf community events and spending time with his family. He was an avid member of the Sacramento Deaf Senior Club.

Doyle was preceded in death by his wife, Charlotte Brown and his two sons, Doyle Brown Jr. and Jeff Sund. He leaves behind his daughters, Molly (Mark) Bowen of Orangevale, CA, Miriam Haggard of Little Rock, AR and Suzanne (Ernie) Peters of Turlock, CA; his son, Raymond Sund of Orangevale, CA; 14 grandchildren and 31 great-grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held at 11 a.m. on Saturday, September 14, 2019 at Turlock Funeral Home, 425 N. Soderquist Rd., Turlock. Interment will be held at 12 p.m. at Turlock Memorial Park, with a reception following.
