“ I have had a lot of fond memories of Rishi mama throughout the years, but the fondest of them all were during my childhood years growing up in the early 80s here in Modesto, Ca. That was when mama first emigrated to the U.S from Fiji. When he arrived, he stayed at our home for a few years. I remember he had a penchant for hot and spicy foods. I remember whenever we were about to sit at the dinner table, he would go to our backyard garden and pick chili peppers from the plants. He would bring them in, wash them and eat multiple chili peppers by dabbing them in salt and eating it with dinner. After watching him doing that, I then got into the habit of eating chili peppers the same way. He got me addicted to chili peppers and spicy foods and to this day I still eat fresh chili peppers all thanks to mama for getting me addicted to it.

I remembered his very first job that he landed was at Church Furniture here in Modesto and how happy he was to find a job. He also made a lot of friends with his magnetic personality. He loved to party a lot and there were days he would be out partying late, and I would remember my concerned dad would be up waiting for him to get home. He loved to play soccer and ended up playing for a soccer team here in Modesto. I remembered how fun it was watching him play soccer over at Pike Park. He loved to work on cars and I always admired what a great mechanic he was. On many occasions he would help fix up my dad's 1972 Chevy Malibu when it ran into problems.

I remembered he bought a cassette player deck, and we would spend hours listening to 1970s Bollywood music. His favorite songs were from the soundtrack of Sholay and Kabhi Kabhi. Him and my dad also loved listening to Fiji bhajans and qawwali and often talk about who their favorite bhajan singer was. During crab season, we would all head out to San Francisco and go crabbing off the pier. Mama and dad would catch a ton of crabs that would fill the entire trunk of our car. I remembered the first car mama bought was a cream-colored Ford LTD. That thing was built like a tank. There would be times he would drop me off and pick me up from school. I

remembered he would pull up to the school to pick me up and he would on purposely blast Fiji bhajans in front of my friends to embarrass me. 😊

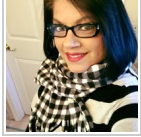
Years later, after he settled down and got his own place, he began working at Campbell Soup with my dad. They both worked the same shift and I remember they had a little tradition of their own where each Friday at the end of their work week, they would stop by the liquor store after work and pick up 2-3 12pk cases of Miller Genuine Draft. They would sit in our garage at 11:30pm at night, along with one of my dad's cousin who also worked with them, with the garage door open enjoying the cool breeze while they enjoyed their beer. They would reminisce about their work week and talk about what to expect the following week when they go back to work on Monday. Sometimes, I would be up and sit with them in the garage listening to them talk. They both would finish their 2-3 cases of beer in no time.

Its childhood memories like these with Rishi mama, no matter how simple it was, that forged a special bond with him. He will always hold a special place in my heart. Whenever we had parties and gatherings, he would always be the life of the party. On many occasions, he would be invited to cook food for a party or wedding as he was such a great cook. While its sad that Rishi mama is no longer with us, I am glad that he is in a better place where he is free of pain and at peace.
