He had a romantic side to him which Mary loved. They had such a love for each other it was genuine and great to be around.

Rick has two sons Andrew 18 and Vince 13; they have his quick wit. He was very involved with his boys; volunteering his time to Rugby, Umpired Baseball, and coached Soccer. He enjoyed playing all sports and games with the boys becoming very competitive. Whatever the boys were involved in Rick was there with them as a fan, providing support. He was a great role model always teaching and trying to prepare them for life. Rick was a graduate of California

State University-Stanislaus with a Bachelor of Administration degree with a concentration in Business Computer Information Systems and Management. Rick was looking forward to seeing his boys graduate from college he was able to see them graduate high school and 8th grade with a mock graduation in the backyard.

Rick was a family man and a father figure to many and for some the father they never had. He provided support, advice, encouragement, he was there when needed. His nieces and nephews expressed their gratitude letting him know the many ways he helped them. Rick was an inspiration; raised by a single mom Gilberta Garcia from their humble beginnings to becoming Vice President and CEO; quite an accomplishment.
